

FEMICIDE

Femicide rates remain high in Ontario, with a total of 40 femicides reported since November 26, 2021 and 12 femicides occurring in the past two months alone. Past research conducted by the Domestic Violence Death Review Committee has examined risk factors associated with femicides and has identified past history of gender-based violence as a future predictor of lethal violence (Domestic Violence Death Review Committee [DVDRC], 2019), a trend that continues to be seen within OAITH's monthly femicide reports. Media reports have identified that at least one of the men charged in femicides occurring this month had a previously documented history of intimate-partner violence, including charges for uttering a threat of bodily harm, assault, breaking and entering, as well as failure to comply with a release order and was on probation at the time of this femicide (Ottawa Citizen, 2022). Additionally, another perpetrator, charged in the death of his grandmother, also faces charges for breaching the terms of a conditional sentence, although the details of that incident have not been reported within the media. These cases highlight the need for greater system collaboration to ensure those engaged within various criminal justice systems are also provided access to community based intervention and prevention initiatives that address root causes of violence and reduce risks for perpetration of future gender-based violence, including lethal violence. As femicide rates continue to remain high throughout Ontario it is imperative that more resources are dedicated to ntervention and prevention models that work towards ending gender-based, violence to ensure future lives are not lost to preventable deaths.
